Title 1 Overview

Title I

- Title I is the most extensive federal aid program for public schools in the United States. Today, Title I is part of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB). This act originated from the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) under the administration of President Lyndon B. Johnson.
- The Title I program funds schools according to the needs of the student population. Funding is based on (but not limited to) student enrollment, as well as the number of students receiving free and reduced lunch.
- These funds are given to the Maryland State Department of Education from the United States Department of Education, which then provides funds to The SEED School of Maryland.
- SEED MD hosts an annual Title I Family Information meeting to engage parents in the development of the Title I application.



Title I Budget

- Direct Student Support Staff \$443,000
- School staff positions \$290,000
- Teacher Support \$108,000
- Student Support \$95,000
- Homeless Services \$4,200
- Equity Training \$15,000
- Indirect costs \$86,000
